	<p>Speaking & Listening - reading with expression and drama Handwriting: To practise letter and number formation using the Nelson Scheme. Phonics – Read Write Inc Phonics. Some children will be starting Daily Guided Reading groups.</p>	
Mathematics	<p>Place value-recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (10s, 1s). Statistics - interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and tables. Addition & subtraction – solving problems. Multiplication and division - recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables.</p>	<p>Fractions - recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 Time - tell and write the time to five minutes, and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times. Measurement - choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in m/cm; mass kg/g, temperature °C and capacity litres/ml.</p>
Science	<p>Animals including humans Taking care and Growing up - Can I make healthy food choices and look after myself?</p>	
Religious Education	<p>Growing up in a Christian Family: How do people show that they belong? What are the symbols of Baptism? What does Baptism show about belonging to the Christian Family?</p>	<p>How some objects help Christians recall events from the life of Jesus.
