

"I help to tidy up." Ahmed "I share the toys." Antonia "I speak kindly to Aiden." Ismail "I can help people." Teagan




"I walk to be safe." Mia "The fire alarm keeps us safe." Can "We tidy up the toys so that we don't fall over." Charlie

We explored our differences and how we can be friends with people who are different.






We learnt that babies need care and support and get more independent as they grow up.

Finally, we created pictures of our families using 2Paint.










In Year 2 we are learning French through songs and short conversation phrases.


Charles Babbage

Charles Babbage (26th December 1791- 18th October 1871) was an English mathematician, philosopher, inventor and engineer. Babbage originated the concept of a digital programmable computer and is considered by some to be the "father of the computer".

Year 5 had a discussion about the life and inventions of Charles Babbage




"Babbage joined the <u>Holmwood</u> Academy which was in Baker street, Enfield. It had a great library where he learnt a lot about <u>maths</u>."

"Babbage <u>realised</u> that books and charts that included calculations such as tide timings had errors in them. He wanted to design a machine that would stop these mistakes"









Year 5 have been learning about the different body parts and how our body changes during puberty. They discussed how these changes can affect our physical body and our emotions as well.


Year 6 have been covering the Year 5 objectives for PSHE that were missed due to lockdown. We have been exploring the changes of our body during puberty.

Golden Lock








