






In Early Years, learning is constantly being reinforced through storybooks! From stories about mini beasts to baking books in the home corner, how many books can you spot?














Coming soon: Online Menu Choice Selection

Starting from the 7th June 2021 we will be introducing a new way to order and pay for your child's school lunches. Many of you will already be familiar with Parentpay.com. However, after half term you will need to log on to parentpay.com and order your child's meals, making a selection from the menu, up to two weeks in advance, or before 8am on the day of the lunch. If your child is absent from school, you can cancel any of your pre-ordered meals before 8am on the day. You will be able to select meals for the 7th June onwards, from the 24th May.

By involving you in your child's meal ordering process, it not only helps you ensure your child enjoys a variety of healthy foods but helps us to reduce food wastage too.

You will still be able to pay for your child's meals at a PayPoint if you prefer to do so, but you must set up and use your online account to order the meals. This new system will only allow you to order meals for your child if you have sufficient credit on their account, so please keep this in mind going forward.


If you do not already have a ParentPay account, in order to set it up, you will need an activation letter. This will be provided to you by the school.

I have provided a step by step guide on how to order your child's meals with this letter.



Guide to Ordering via ParentPay



Step 3 – This will take you through to the menu where you can select the meals for your child. You can navigate through the available weeks, to select meals in advance, by clicking on the box under the date. You are able to select meals up until 8am on the day of booking.



Step 2 - Ensure the drop down box is set to 'Lunchtime'. Click 'Make or View Bookings'



Step 4 – Once you have made the selections you must click 'Confirm Bookings' in the bottom right corner. If your child is UIFSM or FSM you will still need to follow through to payment screen, however no payment will be taken from your account

So far year 2 have planted Strawberries, Courgettes, Peas, Beans, Globe Artichokes, Tomatoes and Leeks. They have learned how deep to dig the holes, how to get the plants out of the pots and how far apart to space the plants. They also found out that fruit plants, like Strawberries and Courgettes will grow a flower and then the fruit.







Year 3 have been planting
Tomatoes, Beans, Courgettes and
Lettuces. After half term they will be
planting lots more vegetables. As
they would normally share with
Year 2, we have created a pop-up
garden outside their window so
they can watch the plants grow and
learn to care for them. The children
learned how to carefully remove the
plants from the pots, how deep to
plant them and how far apart they
need to be.




















Year 6 have planted Runner beans, Leeks, Carrots, Courgettes, Rocket and Tomatoes. The children spaced the plants out well and are able to dig to the correct depth to plant. They carefully patted the soil down after and put in canes for the plants that needed them. They will also be doing some more planting after half term.




ICT and outdoor curriculum in Year 1

Year 2

In ICT we are learning about programming using Scratch Jr.



We used different blocks to create our own sequence. Did you know that you need the flag block to start?

We added our own sprite and background and we created a sequence for our sprite to move to the right/left, up or down.





I learnt how to add more steps to change the outcome of the programme.









We have used our outside area to plant some runner beans and peas. They will need water and sunshine to grow.

Outdoor Learning in Year 3

In Science, we planted sunflowers. We are observing them turn to follow the sunlight every day. In Geography, we made models of the River Rhine out of tin foil, foraging for materials for the river's terrain in our playground.











Computing in Year 3

To compare digital devices, we tried to 'paint' a version of Van Gogh's painting 'The Starry Night' using two different methods: digital painting on a computer and traditional drawing with oil pastels. Then we thought about the benefits of each method.










Year 4 Canal Project: 21st May

Inspired by their recent Canal visit, Year 4 pupils reflected on their memories of being in a natural environment. They chose a natural object to write about memories it brought up.

Next, they used their sketches from the previous week to create an enlarged copy of the view


they saw through the windows at the canal.















Year 5: Computing and Outdoor learning

In computing, we have been learning how to effectively edit and produce a short film.





We then used these techniques to bring our films to life and give our work a more professional finish.

We explored the effects of different filming techniques, such as tilting, panning, zooming and static.









A part of an Enfield Town Schools Partnership project on climate change, Year 5 explored the local area and found opportunities to photograph locations that showed significant environmental impact.





We explored flowers, leaves and whole plants for inspiration to begin our Iznik art tiles. We looked for patterns in nature to help us create our designs.
