This art project is inspired by our Erasmus link with The Netherlands and our Turkish community. How? Delfts Blue pottery is based on the Chinese ceramics and incorporated tulips that originated in Turkey. Iznik pottery is similarly influenced and uses specific colours and patterns.

Spotted

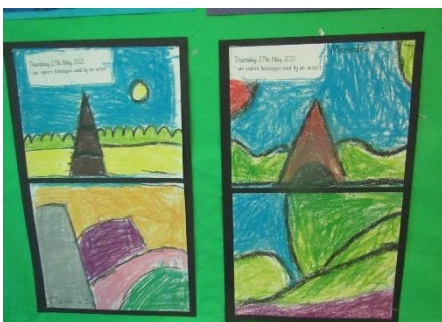
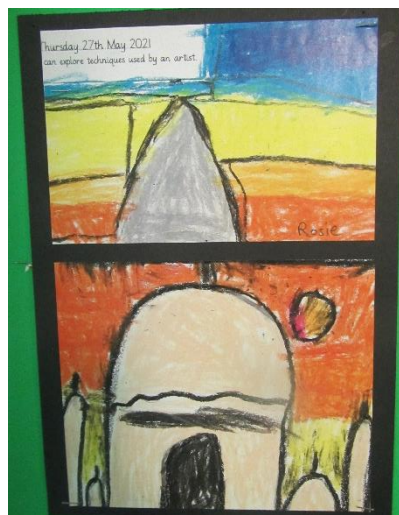
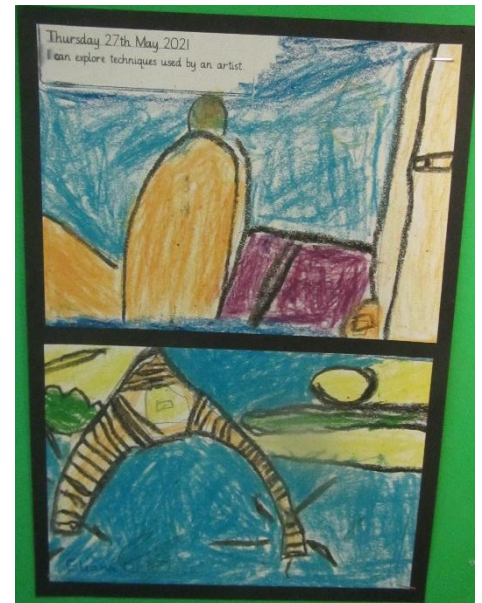
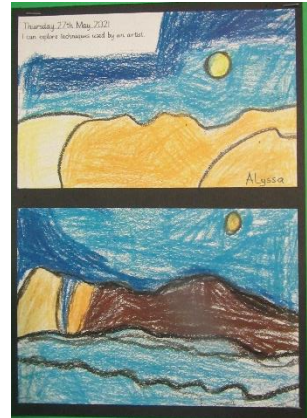
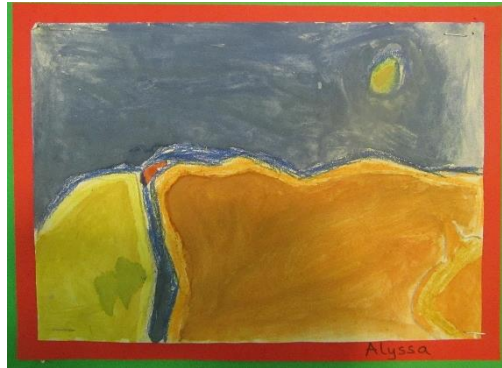
Year 6 fundraiser 9th June 2021

Art in Year 1

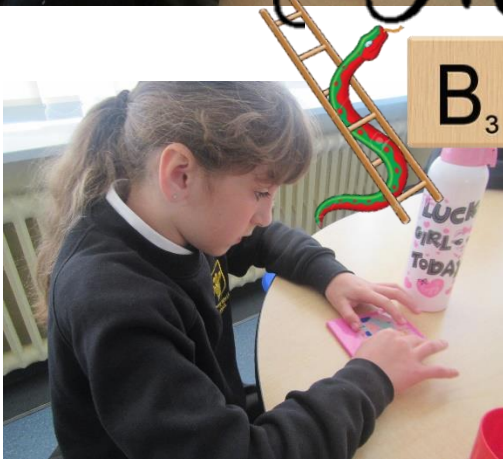

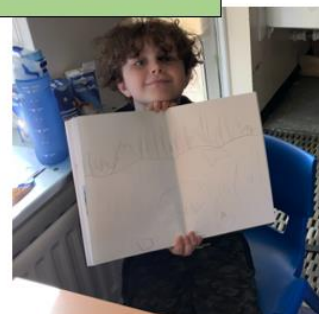
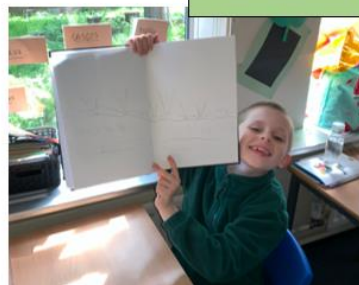


1. Researching about Lindsey Fox's landscape artwork.



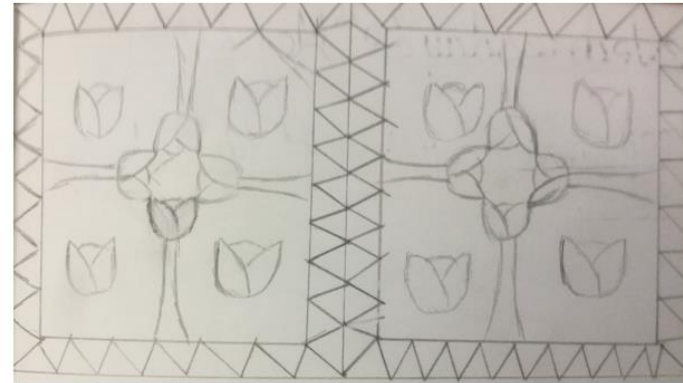

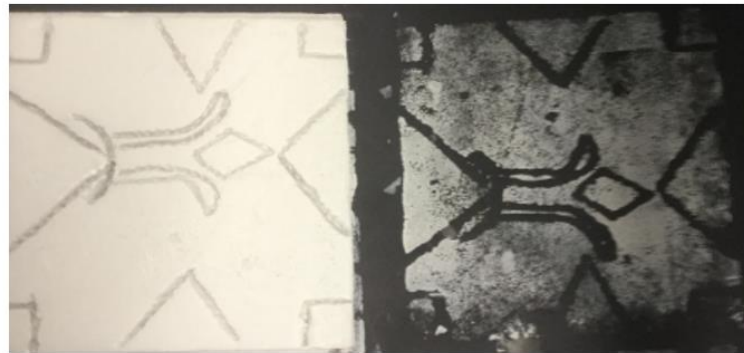


Year 5 : Iznik tile prints

Linking to previous DGR and history topics, year 5 have been looking to recreate their own versions of the iconic Iznik tiles that decoratively dominated the religious buildings and royal palaces during the Ottoman Empire.



We thought about the geometric shapes used in the traditional tiles and how they allowed for a repetitive pattern across many tiles.



By poking holes in our stencil tile, when we covered them in paint, we were able to leave the impression of our designs.

WATER PROJECT

Prince of Wales Primary and our Erasmus partner school in The Netherlands, De Driemaster, have in common that we both have lots of waterways in our school communities. We therefore looked at where the opportunities are in our respective curricula to learn about water. On Friday 11th June four of our Year 5 and 6 pupils presented a summary of this to their Dutch peers in a Teams meeting – water features in every year group.

Miss Clarke explained the context of our school and Mr Bless translated.



De Driemaster pupils found the fact that any water we drink today is the same that has been drunk by dinosaurs 100 million years ago fascinating too.
