
Physical Development in EYFS



Enfield Upcoming Bike Markets and Dr Bike - Cycle Enfield




Year 4 were learning about justice, wisdom and equality in RE.




We learnt about the Knife Angel statue. Can your children tell you why it was made?


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In our P4C lessons – we discussed the main question: Can Sikhs believe in any other Gods?





We read some powerful and inspiring quotes and thought about how these might influence a person, their worldviews and actions.








This week, Year 6 began learning about worldviews by focusing on the incredible achievements and views of Greta Thunberg, Malala Yousafzai and Marcus Rashford.
