Dear Parents/Carers, Governors and Friends,

I hope that many of you were able to attend the live Meet the Teacher sessions this week – Just EYFS and Year 6 left next week. These meetings give valuable information about the learning that will take place in each year group and how school and home will work in partnership to ensure a successful year for your children; it is a partnership with expectations on both sides. It shouldn't be news to parents/carers that your role in children's learning is the most important: the attitudes to learning that they bring to school, the values that have been instilled in them from birth and the support they get in making sense of the learning at school and the world around them. The most important thing we can ask from parents/carers is to give their child 'time'. Time to listen, time to talk, time to read, time to visit places of interest (doesn't have to be far or cost anything), time to play, time to answer their questions, time to help with homework and much more time besides.

Some years ago I calculated how much time was spent at school in comparison to not in school and this is a useful reminder: If children attend school daily for up to 7 hours in a 190 day academic year, what % of a full calendar year (24 hours x 365 days) is spent out of school? 1330: 8760 = 0.15 or 15%. Did you expect it to be that little? Now think about the 85% outside the school – even if you take off another 40% for sleeping, that leaves a lot of time. Recently, I listened to a debate about quality time v quantity time. What do you think is more important? There is plenty said about this already to help you work this out and here is a good start whilst pondering this question: Quality Time or Quantity Time with Your Kids?

Railway Safety

Due to the very high level of trespassing on the tracks by young people in our local area, Network Rail in partnership with Learn Live are working to help raise awareness to students across the UK educating them about the dangers of the train tracks through interactive digital delivery.

Network Rail has created a number of age appropriate videos to watch and discuss with your child.

The session is less than 15 minutes and explains why it is important to stay safe near the tracks.

Over 12 million students, parents and teachers from across the UK have watched these videos which has led to a significant decrease in the number of trespasses in their area through watching the safety videos.

There is now a new interactive video suitable for all ages called I Am Train Safe (see link below)

Remember 15 mins can help save lives and provide important safety information to young people.

too. What a lovely Friday afternoon!


