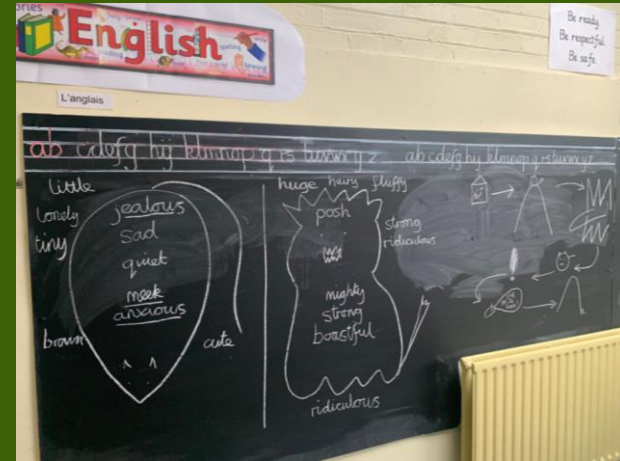

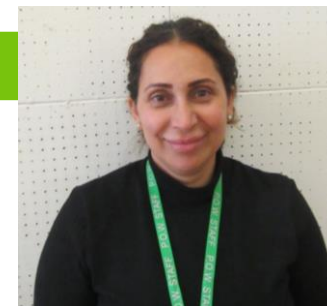

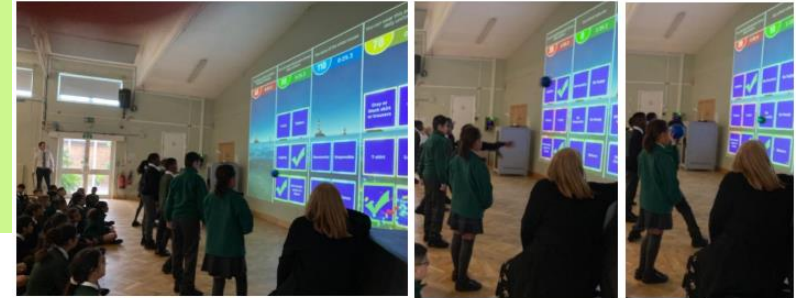

School starts promptly at 8.40am and finishes at 3.20pm.

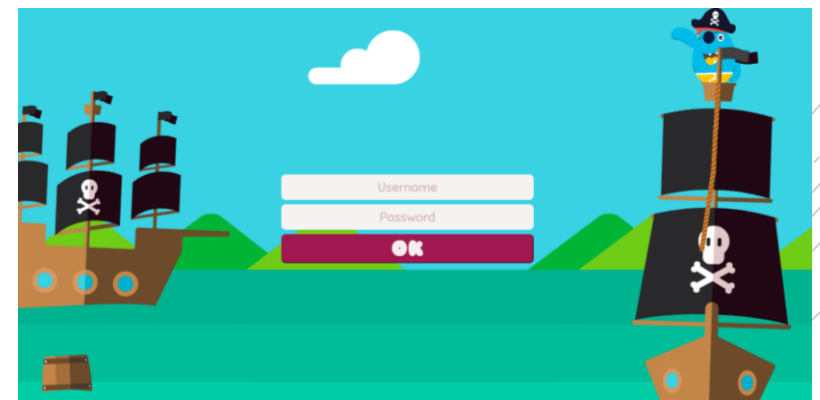

Uniform

Children should come to school in full school uniform

Grey skirt or trousers and no leggings

Plain black shoes with black soles

Plimsolls for indoor PE and trainers for outdoor PE

Black or green hair bands

No jewellery. Only small ear studs allowed

No nail varnish

PE kit (white/black shorts and white t-shirt)

Children should have two books

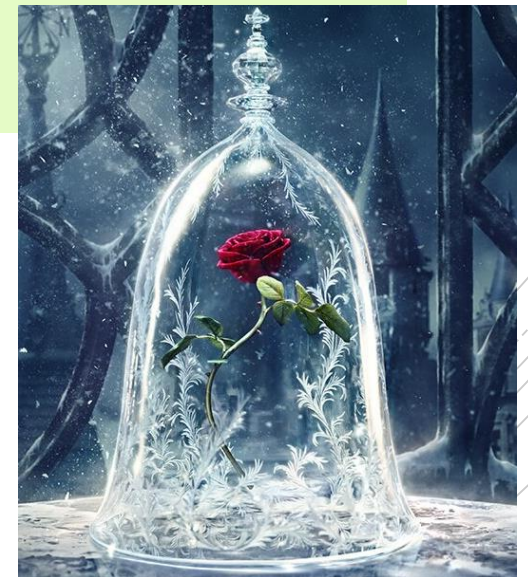
- Accelerated reading book
