Step 6: Book Appointments (Automatic)

If it wasn't possible to book every selected teacher during the time you are able to attend, you can either adjust the teachers you wish to book with and try again, or switch to manual booking mode.

Step 7: Book Appointments

You can optionally leave a message for the teacher to say what you want to discuss, or raise anything beforehand.



This week, Lagan's Foundation in Bolton have kindly stepped in after delays in sourcing this and gifted our school a defibrillator. The actual price of the equipment is £1700.00 and is a more advanced piece of equipment so this is very generous donation. We hope to never having to use the defibrillator but it is peace of mind knowing that we have this.
