Last week we have been discussing different foods the children like to eat at home. Brian (6Ta) bought in his mum's recipe for Brazilian Cheese Bread and he was very happy to share it with us. It was exciting finding out about new ingredients such as Tapioca Starch.

Brian's (6Ta) mum, kindly donated us the Tapioca starch.

Mr Whitehorn provided us with some treats from the Caribbean, such as Mango, hard Dough Bread, Bun and Cheese.

We all had lots of fun cooking together, especially the children who really enjoyed eating the cheese bread afterwards



Brian's mums Brazilian Cheese Bread Recipe

Ingredients:

- 3 eggs
- 1 cup of milk
- 1 cup of oil
- 1 teaspoon of salt
- 500g grated cheese
- 500g of tapioca starch



Method:

1. First put the eggs, milk, oil and salt into a bowl and then beat them together using a mixer, whisk or a wooden spoon.
2. After that, add the cheese and the tapioca starch to the mixture.
3. Next, continue to mix all the ingredients together.
4. Carefully place a scoop of the mixture into muffin tins.
5. Finally, bake in a preheated oven at 180 degrees for around 20mins.

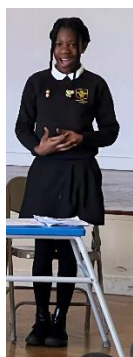
Team 2 had two more motions to prepare for in less than 2 weeks but they rose to the challenge. They debated on two new topics:



Iznik Designs - A long lost tradition

The pottery tradition stretches back to prehistoric times, but the art form blossomed under the Ottomans. In the late 15th century, craftsmen of Iznik replaced the traditional clay used in ceramics with quartz. The innovative technique produced a bright white base that made the four traditional colors found in Iznik pieces—turquoise, cobalt, malachite, and coral—stand out under a thick transparent glaze.

Ottoman sultans favored the new look and soon exquisite Iznik *çini* (pronounced "chee-nee"), as the tiles are known locally, adorned public spaces and important buildings in Istanbul, including the court's main residence, Topkapi Palace. Iznik ceramics spread far and wide, even piquing the interest of Genoese and Venetian merchants. This golden era lasted for about 100 years. The decline of the Ottoman Empire meant a loss of protection for the craft, which had all but disappeared by the late 17th century. For the next several hundred years, original Iznik pieces appeared solely in art brokerages and museums worldwide (including the Louvre and the Smithsonian).

Today, a renewed interest in Ottoman heritage has sparked efforts to restore Iznik *çini* to their former glory. Turkish organizations such as the Iznik Foundation and Anikya are working to bring the craft out from the museums back into everyday life. Their founders come from different backgrounds—including academia, art, and business—but they are united by a fondness for the rich self-expression featured in Iznik ceramics and for the style's potential to revive the traditions of the past through modern, functional art.

Iznik & Delft Pottery

As a result of Erasmus funding, we learnt about the links between Turkish and Dutch ceramic tiles. Year 5 pupils made their own versions using printing techniques. To conclude the Erasmus project, the Dutch partnerschool De Driemaster in The Hague will be presented one of our prints.



Looking to previous D&R and history topics, we have been looking to recreate our own versions of the iconic Iznik tiles that decoratively dominated the religious buildings and royal palaces during the Ottoman Empire.

We discussed the different artistic elements of Iznik tiles during our art investigation.

We thought about the geometric shapes used in the traditional tiles and how they allowed for a repetitive pattern across many tiles.



We worked hard to take our designs to the next stage. Once our designs were completed, we taped the designs to polyethylene like ready for printing.



By pressing tiles in our clay tiles, when we covered them in paint, we were able to leave the impression of our designs.

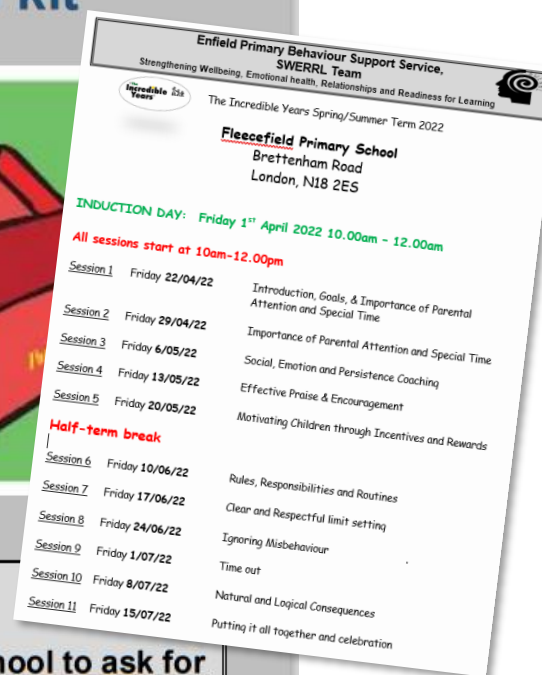
