Hello, I am Ms. Tootill and I am one of the Year 5 teachers. **British Sign Language (BSL)** is close to my heart because I was born with a hearing defect and, by the time I was 10 years old, I was fitted with my first pair of hearing aids.

A Bill to recognise BSL as a registered language of England, Wales and Scotland has been put forward to parliament. It has passed all three stages in The House of Commons and is currently at the third stage in The House of Lords. The deaf community are hoping that it passes before going into the final stages and, ultimately, becoming a registered language in the UK.

There are many languages spoken at POW, and I would love BSL to be another. Each week, I will introduce a BSL sign to the children in our Values Assembly and share it in the weekly newsletter. Please come and say 'Hello' using your BSL when you see me!
