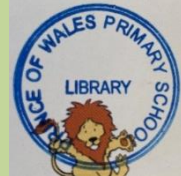

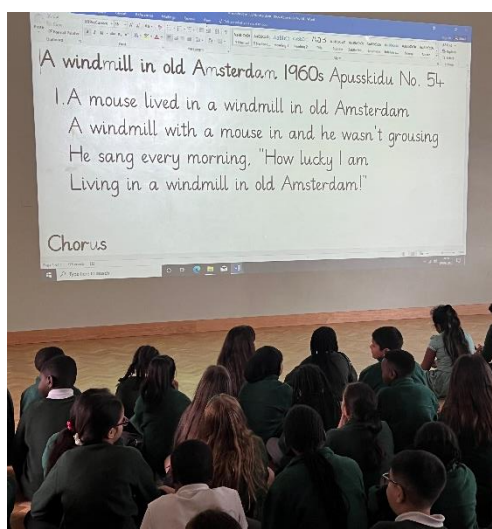
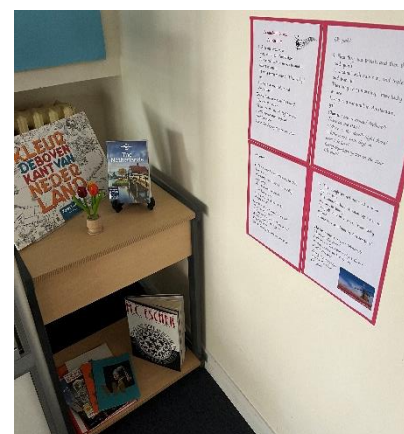
The dental staff commented on how P.O.W are always so friendly and well organised and the children are so engaging and polite.

During the Easter Holidays, I visited our Erasmus partner school the Driemaster in The Hague. There we discussed our project on increasing pupils' vocabulary, reading, outdoor learning, Parent Cafés, behaviour strategies and much more.

We exchanged books for each other's school libraries and also some work that children had made. Outside the Square Hall you can see a display with artefacts that we have accumulated during the past years.

The visit was also an opportunity to gather new ideas to enhance learning at our school. Amazing bronze and iron age burial mounds I saw will enhance our History and PSHE; an exhibition by Remy Jungerman, artist from Suriname, will inspire an art project and I was fascinated to witness the impact of beavers that were released in 2002 as a beaver pair now resides in Enfield.
