Community Cooking with Len 1 - parents' own recipes







Cindy's own kofte

- 500g of lamb mince meat
- 4 large potatos grated
- 1 large onion grated
- 2 eggs
- Breadcrumbs (usually just grate some sliced of bread)
- Finely chopped parsley
- Salt
- Pepper
- Add uncooked lamb into a tray/large bowl then add the onions, parsley, eggs, breadcrumb, grated potato, salt and pepper
- 2. Mix all ingredients together usually using your hands, like making dough you gave to need its although. Then leave in the fridge for about an hour to set.
- 3. Once it has had time to chill then take small meat ball size balls and either roll in to the shape of a meat ball or kofta and shallow fry for about 10/12 min 5/6 mins each side.

This can usually make around 50 kofte. Really nice served with some chips and a salad.









Community Cooking with Len 2 - parents' own recipes

10-minute chicken fajita tray bake

- 600g chicken breast stir-fry, strips of chicken
- 40g packet spice mix for fajitas
- 12 small white corn tortillas
- 2 green shallots
- 280g jar Coles Chargrilled Peppers, drained, coarsely chopped
- 200g tub avocado dip
- Crème fraîche, to serve
- Fresh coriander sprigs, to serve
- Oi
- Preheat grill on high. Drizzle half of the 1 tbs oil over a baking tray. Place the tray under the grill to heat
- 2. While the oil on the tray is heating, place the chicken4
- 3. Once the oil is hot, arrange the chicken mixture in a single layer on the tray. Drizzle over the remaining 1/2 tbs oil. Return the tray to the grill and cook for 3 minutes.
- 4. Meanwhile, wrap the tortillas in foil and place under the grill with the chicken. Chop the shallots.
- 5. Add the peppers to the tray with the chicken and toss to combine. Return to the grill for 2 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through.

Serve the chicken grill bake with the warmed tortillas, avocado dip and crème fraîche, sprinkled with the shallot and coriander

Wraps & Flat bread

Ingredients


- Greek style flat breads 1 packet
- tortilla wraps 1 packet
- Pitta breads x 6 pack
- Grated cheddar cheese, Halloumi cheese, or any other cheese you prefer
- Cucumber slices
- Grated carrot
- Tomatoes, Chopped or sliced
- Peppers Cut into pieces or slices
- Greek style yogurt

- Coriander or Parsley (fresh) Chopped finely!
- Hummus
- Cajun spice, Cumin spice,
- Jerk Seasoning
- Chicken fillets or Breast of Chicken, x 4 -Approx
- Lamb Koffas , Readymade or make yourselves
- (Buy Greek style or Turkish sausages, from Shops) Spicy but tasty!
- Salt & Pepper
- Sweet chilli sauce
- Lettuces of your choice, (ie) little gems or Rocket salad

Method

- 1. Season chicken fillets or breast of chicken, with Jerk seasoning, or Cajun spice, best to leave marinated for a couple of hours in the fridge.
- 2. Fry of chicken in a frying pan, on a medium heat, cook above 75 degrees,. leave to one side covered in foil.
- 3. Cut Chicken Breast into fillets, place inside Wraps or Pitta bread.
- 4. Wash any lettuce or tomatoes, cucumber, you may use, then chop to your desired size, beware when using sharp knife,
- 5. Warm up wraps or Pop Pitta bread in toaster, or in oven for 2 mins.
- 6. Make up wrap or Pitta breads with any of the ingredients above, for your own taste & preference.
- 7. Add yogurt, or make a mint yogurt, for more flavour, sweet chilli sauce, Hummus spread on wraps or pitta bread, then place chicken plus any combination of fillings.

Spotted

Have our children seen the crow's nest on the Island in our playground? Have they come across crow's nests on ships in stories? See how high our resident crow has built hers. She has a commanding view of the surrounding area.





A crow's nest is also a structure in the upper part of the main mast of a ship or a structure that is used as a lookout point.

On ships, this position ensured the widest field of view for lookouts to spot approaching hazards, other ships, or land by using the naked eye or optical devices such as telescopes or binoculars.

According to William Scoresby Jr., the crow's nest was invented in the 19th century by his father, William Scoresby Sr., a whaler and also an Arctic explorer. Crow's nests appear in Egyptian reliefs as early as 1200 BC and on eighth to seventh century BC representations of Phoenician, Etruscan, and Boiotian ships. Theon of Smyrna wrote that by climbing the mast of a ship, one could see land that is invisible to those on deck.

The first recorded appearance of the term was in 1807, used to describe Scoresby Sr.'s barrel crow's nest platform.

Since the crow's nest is a point far away from the ship's center of mass, rotational movement of the ship is amplified and could lead to severe seasickness, even in accustomed sailors. Therefore, being sent to the crow's nest was also considered a punishment

Meadow Song Project and Art Year 3 Summer Café
















We have been looking at the artist Claude Monet. We have made our own landscapes, using the wetlands as a stimulus.
