- 4. **BeeZee Families**: A FREE, award-winning, in-person service delivered near you for the whole family. Make friends and learn about simple healthy changes as a family. Weekly physical activities, cook-along's, free snacks, and simple advice and support from people that care.

Inspired by the theme of the Jubilee and celebrating the past 7 decades of Queen Elizabeth on The Throne, Miss Clarke each class the challenge to design a throne based on the decade they were studying by transforming an old school chair. Each week, a different year group will feature their chair and dance in the newsletter starting with Year 6.

#### 1955 ROSA PARKS THRONE by 6T

On 1st of December 1955, in Montgomery Alabama, Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a bus for a white person despite this being the law. While she was a huge inspiration to the black community and this incident helped to spark the Montgomery bus boycott that last for over a year.

Rosa Parks act of defiance and the Montgomery bus boycott became important symbols of the Civil right movement of the 50's. She became an international icon of resistance to racial segregation and worked with Martin Luther King Jr to help create change.

This year, we studied Rosa Parks in history which was our inspiration for the throne.

'Our class was inspired by the artwork of Robert Rauschenberg. Robert Rauschenberg was an artist who created montages and graphic designs based on major events from the time (1950s – 1960s). We decided to use graphic art to print pictures of Rosa Parks and other important images from this event. We then used PVA glue to stick the pictures onto the chair to create our montage. Then, we added the bus (made from cardboard) and the two picket signs. We are very proud of the throne and the important message that it depicts.' By Nihal













#### 1953 DNA THRONE by 6B

We created a throne to represent DNA. Which was discovered in 1953. Does anyone know what DNA stands for? De-oxy-ribose- nucleic- acid. This is what makes up our features and characteristics. It determines what colour eyes, hair and skin we will have. It also gives us our height and shoe size. It is the Human make-up. DNA was discovered from the work of three scientists. James Watson, Francis Crick and Rosalind Franklin (who discovered that it had a double helix).

It is made up of a sugar phosphate back bone and is connected by four chemical elements: Thymine and Adenine; Cytosine and Guanine. These elements can only be matched in these pairs. DNA is a twisted structure as shown by our chair.

To make our throne, we use art straws, pipe cleaners and pom-poms to show the physical structure of DNA. We also drew and found pictures to represent what DNA is and what it creates in a human body. We glued these pictures on in a decoupage style.

Clean Air Day, the UK's largest campaign on air pollution is on **Thursday 16 June 2022.** Air pollution is the biggest environmental threat to our health, no matter who you are or where you live. It can harm every organ in your body and can shorten our lives, contribute towards chronic illness and put us more at risk from COVID-19.

This Clean Air Day there are simple steps we can all take to cut down on the pollution we cause and use our voices to fight for a cleaner air future. This year we're focusing on walking, cycling, scootering, which have positive benefits for our health and the planet.

There are many ways we can take action for cleaner air:

- Talk at home about harms of air pollution, specifically how it impacts your health (see resources on the <u>Clean Air Day</u> website).
- Walk: walk to school (or part of the journey from a nearby location) on Clean Air Day
- Ask write to local and national decision makers to describe what would make their walk to school and local shops easier and have clean air in your community.









#### 1955 LEGO TRHONE by 6Ta

6Ta's jubilee throne is inspired by the Danish invention of 'Lego', which comes from the Danish phrase 'Leg Godt', which means play well.

The popular children's building toy was invented by Ole Kirk Christiansen, whose main profession was a carpenter. However, times were tough and there wasn't much work available for Christiansen, meaning that unfortunately he lost his business. So, he began to make the first blocks of Lego out of left-over pieces of wood.

Lego went on to be a huge worldwide commercial success. It first went on sale in the UK in 1955 and the company has gone on to produce nearly 600 billion bricks! It has had very successful crossover toys with other popular franchises, such as Star Wars, Batman, Jurassic Park and Marvel Comics. Lego has also produced several video games and movies.

#### Our throne has 3 main elements:

- 1. The collage base We all printed out several small pictures of our favourite Lego characters and emblems and stuck them to our chair. We then covered the overlapping images in PVA glue to give it a shiny finish.
- 2. The Lego Brick Facts Wall We linked red and white Lego bricks (the first original colours of Lego) and recorded interesting information about Lego onto them. Did you know that Lego is the largest producer of wheels in the word?!
- 3. The Lego centre piece Some of us worked with Mr Whitehorn to make the numbers '1955' in white and red bricks, along with some of our favourite Lego characters and pieces.

Over all, it was a great experience to collaborate on different sections of our throne and seeing all the segments come together was really worthwhile. We all feel proud of our throne and we hope you like it too.

#### 1952 CORONATION THRONE by 6C

On the 6<sup>th</sup> February 1952, Queen Elizabeth ascended to the throne to become Queen due to her Father's death (George VI) at the very young age of 25 years. However, her Coronation did not happen until 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1953.

Her Coronation was especially significant because it was the first one to be televised and saw around 10 million tune in across the world! In fact, many people bought the newly invented television just to watch the Queen Coronation. Did you know the Coronation lasted for 3 hours and was attended by 8,000 guests?

The Crown jewels are a very important and are made up of the Orb, Sceptres and the crown itself and are kept in the highly secure Tower of London. The crown is made of gold and set with 2,868 diamonds, 17 sapphires, 11 emerald's, 269 pearls and 4 rubies! The Sovereign Sceptre has been used at every Coronation since 1661 and still has the biggest uncut diamond, in the world, with a 3,106-carat diamond!








#### The idea of using a chair in art

As a throne it was the reserve for rulers, now the chair accompanies us daily. As both a design object and a work of art, chairs and thrones featured readily in paintings and installations. The idea of taking a pre-existing object and elevating it into art probably started with a chair: **Pablo Picasso**'s **Still Life With Chair Caning** from 1912 where the artist collaged a piece of woven chair backing onto a two-





dimensional canvas. Not long after, **Marcel Duchamp**used a kitchen stool in Bicycle Wheel in 1913. Since then, artists have used the chair as a way of expressing their ideas in many creative ways.

### LETS MAKE CARROT CUPCAKES

#### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- & grated)
- · 150ml orange juice
- 140a sultanas
- 80ml vegetable oil
- 3 tablespoons natural yoghurt
- 115g plain flour
- · 115g self-raising flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon • 100g dark muscovado sugar
- · 2 eggs

#### MAKES 16

Each cake contains 164 kral 6G fat 13.5G suga

#### WHAT TO DO:

- 3 medium/large carrots (peeled 1. Pre-heat the oven to 160C/ fan 140C/ Gas mark 3. Put paper cases onto a bun tray.
  - 2. Put the sultanas and orange juice in a bowl and
  - 3. Mix together the plain flour, self-raising flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda and cinnamon.
  - 4. Combine the eggs and sugar in a separate bowl and
  - whisk until thick and foamv. 5. Slowly add the oil and yoghurt and continue
  - whisking until combined. 6. Add the flour mixture in batches and fold in gently.
  - 7. Drain the sultanas, then add the sultanas and carrots into the cake mixture.
  - 8. Spoon the mixture into the paper cases and bake in the oven for 25 minutes. You can tell when the cakes are cooked by inserting a skewer into the cake – if it comes out clean, they're done!
