POW THRONES

1969 GOLDEN TICKET THRONE by 5T

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl, one of the most loved and read children's books was written in 1964. What is not to like about the story of a boy who against the odds obtains a Golden Ticket to win a tour of an amazing chocolate factory run by an imaginative chocolatier, Willy Wonka, and his staff of Oompa-Loompas. Roald Dahl's imagination delighted young and old readers alike and this story continues the enthrall new audiences.





For research purposes and to obtain suitable craft materials, the children ate a variety of chocolate bars for home work and brought the wrappers back to school. These were attached to the chair, together with a number of Golden Tickets.

On the day, the Queen awarded the trophy to the team and medals to the 11 players who were on the pitch at the end of the match. In 2009, the rest of the team and all the staff members were awarded medals and it was recognised that it was a team effort, as it took more than just the 11 players to win the World Cup. Our throne features all of the team, as well as the managers and coaches.

1966 WORLD CUP THRONE by 5R


This is one of the most famous sporting quotes in English history, and we used this as our inspiration to create our throne to celebrate England winning the Football World Cup in 1966. The 1960's was an era of change and it was a time of optimism and the greatest optimists were the football supporters who thought that England could win! But they were proved right. The World Cup was hosted by England and the final against West Germany was played at Wembley; England won 4-2 in extra time.







In History we were focusing on the Queen's reign over the last 70 years and in 5R specifically on this event of 1966. We used lots of pictures of her presenting the trophy to the England players. We enjoyed researching the football team and the sporting spectacular and loved creating our own throne to represent this amazing achievement.



1969 MOON LANDING THRONE by 5G

The Lunar Module Eagle landed carrying Armstrong and Aldrin, on the Sea of Tranquillity on July 20, 1969.

President Kennedy made an appeal to the special Congress on May 25, 1961 saying: "I believe this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to Earth." This was exactly what happened!

Class 5G used this famous quote by Neil Armstrong to inspire us create our 'throne' depicting the most famous moon landing for mankind. The throne reveals one footprint of Neil Armstrong.

It must have been the most exciting, breathtaking yet challenging moment for both of the Americans, Neil Armstrong and Edward Aldrin to step on soil outside our own planet.

"That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." We reimperhant the famous



We reimagined the famous footprint on our throne to demonstrate Armstrong's first moon walk by examining the print from photos and then figure out a way to recreate this. One child's wellington boot had similar deep grooves and he stepped into thick playdough to mimic the deep imprint of this famous photograph. Once hardened it was painted. A small photo of Earth and the American flag against the black backdrop gives the right effect.
