## Heatwave

Due to a Red Weather Warning, parents have the option to collect their child(ren) earlier on Monday and Tuesday at 11:30am before the worst heat of the day kicks in. Please respond to the email message sent earlier today and complete the form if you wish to do this. The second transition morning for children on Monday will go ahead from 9:15am to 10:00am to spend time with their new teacher and class. The Drop-in on Monday has been changed to Wednesday.
To help manage the heat wave on Monday and Tuesday, we recommend that children wear lightweight, light-coloured and loose-fitting clothing. Wearing non-uniform on these two days is acceptable. Flowing garments allows air circulation and light coloured fabrics reflect light and heat. This will keep children cooler. Wearing natural fibre fabrics; cotton, linen and silk work best in absorbing sweat and allow the skin to breathe. Please also send your child with a hat or cap (labelled), cold bottle of water (you may want it stored in your freezer first) and having sun cream applied before they come to school.

## Noughties Tech Throne by 1H

The 1 H class throne focusses on 2007, from the 00s (noughties) decade. We have learnt about the significant change in technology in our decade as we compared the Nokia 3210 (launched in September 2000) to the first iPhone that was launched in 2007. The first iPhone is represented on the back of our chair, where the children designed and drew their own sketches of iPhones with their own apps to represent a smartphone.
Some significant events that happened in our decade are reflected in the chair. These include President Barack Obama becoming the first black president in the United States in 2009 and the Tsunami of 2004.



## Millennium Dome Throne by 1W

Year 1's focus for their history lessons was the 2000s. We learned why the 2000s were important and what major events happened during that decade, including the invention of the iPhone. ## Dr. Wangari Maathai (1940-2011)

Dr. Wangari Maathai was a Kenyan scholar and an internationally recognised environmental and human rights activist.

In 1977, she founded the Green Belt Movement which introduced the idea of planting trees to help conserve the environment. However, the movement involves more than just planting trees. They work with local communities to hire women's groups to plant the trees in an effort to not only improve the local environment but improve the lives of the people living in it.

This holistic approach to this sustainability project has led Green Belt Movement to be incredibly successful having planted over 51 million trees to date.


Wangari Maathai achieved many 'firsts' in her lifetime! She was the first African woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize in 2004, the first person to receive the Nobel Peace prize in the name of environmental efforts, as well as being the first woman from East and Central Africa to receive a doctorate.

In 2002, she was elected to the Kenyan Parliament with $98 \%$ of the vote and served as the Assistant Minister for Environment, Natural Resources and Wildlife.

## Supporting your child's device use as they start secondary school.

Moving from primary school and into secondary school can be an overwhelming time for children as their online world opens up, particularly if they're getting their own phone for the first time. Here are some top tips and advice on how to
 support them.

## Wellbeing and screen time.

 It's worth having a conversation with your child about setting limits on time spent on their devices. Research has shown that children's brains, behaviour and sleep patterns can all be affected by how much time they spend on screens.Platforms are often designed to keep us scrolling, so make sure your child is aware of this and try to agree limits on screen time together.

## Risks

Talk about online risks such as inappropriate content and cyberbullying. According to Ofcom $66 \%$ of 8-11 year olds say that there is pressure to be popular on social media.
Children often feel like they have to fit in and earn 'likes', which can lead to risky behaviour.
It's really important to let them know that they can come to you if they have problems online.

> False and misleading information Encourage children to think critically about what they are viewing or reading online, so they're not tricked into reading and sharing false or misleading information.

> Keep up to date with online trends You don't need to be TikTok or Twitch royalty, but by continuing to talk to your child about the latest platforms and apps they can keep you informed about what's going on in their online lives.
