Dear Parents/Carers, Governors and Friends,

It was with great sadness that we received the news of death of Her Majesty The Queen yesterday evening. We have now entered a period of national mourning that will continue until the end of the State Funeral.

We have been informed by the Department for Education that Schools and Further Education settings will remain open and normal attendance is expected. You can access more information about the mourning period on www.royal.uk. A bank holiday is expected to be declared for the day of this funeral; however, this has not yet been confirmed. If a bank holiday is declared, schools will close.



At Prince of Wales, we marked this sad and historic event with an assembly for Years 2 to 6 during which we celebrated Queen Elizabeth's life and looked ahead to the coronation of King Charles III. The children perfectly understood the solemnity of this occasion. Afterwards, they had the opportunity to write a message, draw a picture or recount a memory of the Queen.

<u>Pakistan flooding</u> – we have a number of families who will have families and friends in Pakistan. Our thoughts are with all affected by the recent disastrous flooding.


