Dear Parent/Carers, Governors and Friends,

Road Safety Week

This year's road safety week coincided with our school street survey. Out of 80 responses, 66 were in favour of limiting the use of Salisbury Road for car use during drop-off and collection times. A survey among our pupils echoes the views of the majority of adults in supporting a school street, safety being the main issue as well as air pollution. The main concerns among those objecting against this initiative include: parking issues moving to nearby roads instead, unreliable local public transport not being a viable alternative, very young children having to walk especially when it is cold and wet weather, staff being affected due to increased traffic outside the school street boundary (especially congestion in Ordnance Road). We will pass these concerns to the decision making authorities.

ETSP Spelling Bee Competition

The annual Spelling Bee competition between schools from the Enfield Town Schools Partnership started this week with heats among sets of four schools with winners going on to the final. Having won in all previous years we were of course as competitive as ever to keep at least one trophy on display in our foyer. Turn to page 4 for the results.





Year 4 – Learning in our community

Last week, Year 4 went to the local Mosque in Ponders End. We met with the Imam who took us on a tour of the Mosque and spent time explaining the different features of a Mosque and why were important to Muslims.

The Imam also let us view the Dhuhr prayer. It was a new experience for a lot of the children and it was interesting to see the collective worship take place.

The children learnt a lot about Islam and we would like to thank the Imam for welcoming us.

















At Prince of Wales, RE is taught as an academic subject where pupils find out about what different people believe and how they practise their religion. RE does important work encouraging young people to value themselves and the communities within which they live. In their future, our pupils will be working and spending time alongside people from other religions, so it's essential that they know enough about these to do this successfully. In tackling difficult questions, we provide our children with insight that can work to challenge stereotypes, promote community cohesion, and tackle extremism. In RE, our teachers won't try to change children's beliefs or force them to be religious.

As with all educational trips, visiting a place of worship reinforces and expands on what has been learnt in class. They allow children first-hand experiences of artefacts, stories and enable them to consider the importance of special places in their own lives and those of others.







After last week's group discussion, parents and their children made an enthusiastic start at preparing and cooking their Greek wraps which included lamb Koftas, spicy chicken skewers and beef & cheese kebabs. We made different fillings for each of their own accompaniments to go with the meat option to roll up with the flat breads. We practised skills of chopping and skewering meats. This was a reasonably priced evening meal of £1.29 per portion of each wrap.

Hope they enjoyed and everyone is looking forward to chocolate dessert next week!





















Healthy Lentil and Feta Frittata

Ingredients:

FRITTATA

8 eggs

½ cup low fat milk

1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil

1 brown onion, thinly sliced

400g can lentils, rinsed, drained

310g jar roasted capsicum strips, drained (about 2/3 cup)

100g feta, crumbled

2 tablespoons chives, chopped, plus extra to serve

TOMATO SALAD

4 tomatoes, cut into wedges (use different colours and shapes if available)

½ red onion, thinly sliced

3 tsp extra virgin olive oil

1 tsp balsamic vinegar

¼ cup small fresh basil leaves

Method:

FRITTATA

- 1. Preheat oven to 200°C/180°C fan forced. Crack the eggs into a bowl, add milk and whisk. Season with salt and pepper
- 2. Heat oil in a 20cm ovenproof frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the onion and cook for 5 minutes or until light golden. Add lentils and capsicum, stir to combine
- 3. Pour in the egg mixture and scatter with feta and chives. Bake in the oven for around 15-20 minutes or until cooked. Meanwhile, make the tomato salad
- 4. Remove frittata from oven, leave to cool for 5 minutes before removing from pan. Scatter with extra chives and serve with the tomato salad

TOMATO SALAD

1. Combine tomato and onion in a bowl. Drizzle with oil and vinegar, season with pepper and scatter with basil leaves




Year 2 Café


I can read a story with pictures, and I liked the movie!
