Year 6 can't get enough of MacBeth

Year 6 Speech Day

Year 6 children watched Greta Tunberg's address at the U.N.'s Climate Action Summit in 2019. It was of course powerful and served as inspiration for our children to think what they might say at such event. This was the best speech in 6W:

Hello my name is Humahira and I am in 6W. I am here today to talk to you about the seriousness of climate change and how it is affecting not just England but the whole world.
