
At POW, we are talking about STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics). Think about...





Dear children, staff, parents and friends,



Another term is coming to a close and I can see how busy you have all been with your learning. You have so many opportunities to learn in exciting ways at Prince of Wales including your science day and year 5 science trip, your production of Aladdin and the outdoor orienteering cafes.

I spent last week volunteering at an Elephant Rescue and Rehabilitation Centre in Thailand founded by an incredible woman called Lek. Many Asian elephants are very badly treated: some have been working in illegal logging; some have had to beg on the streets; some have been forced to perform in circuses or shows; and some have been forced to trek for hours and hours every day. Fortunately, some of the elephants have been rescued and began their new life at the park without being chained up. They can form their own friendships and they like to bathe in the river, roll in the mud and particularly enjoy eating fresh watermelon, cucumbers and bananas. Whilst I was there I had different jobs to do every day including cutting down banana trees, preparing watermelons, sorting bananas, cleaning their water tanks and even scooping up elephant poo. Did you know they make paper out of elephant poo?

I also visited a school nearby and the children showed me how to make a bracelet. There was even a group of girls playing with the Rubik Cube. Would I still see these in your playground? I listened to a music concert there and, although there were no recorders, there were some wind instruments. Many of the children come from Myanmar, China and Cambodia and some of their parents work at the Elephant Rescue Centre. Some of the fathers work as mahouts. Do you know what a mahout is?

I shall think of you all at the Easter Bonnet Parade and look forward to seeing photographs of Aladdin and the end of term certificate assembly. I wish you all a very Happy Easter and a lovely holiday.


