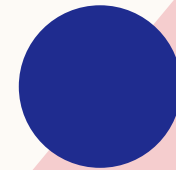


- Read Write Inc. scheme used across the school from EYFS
- Children are prepared for their Phonics Screening in Year 1 – June
- Assessed regularly to ensure the sounds taught and books children take home are appropriate to their level
- Supports reading of unfamiliar words and spelling



1:1 READING

- All children read with an adult at least once across a week
- Reading also happens ‘informally’ during lessons and staff will use this to assess as well
- Reading Champions across the school support their peers with Buddy reading
- This is time to revisit unfamiliar sounds or those your child might not be as confident in
- Also, to ask questions about the text – DGR skills

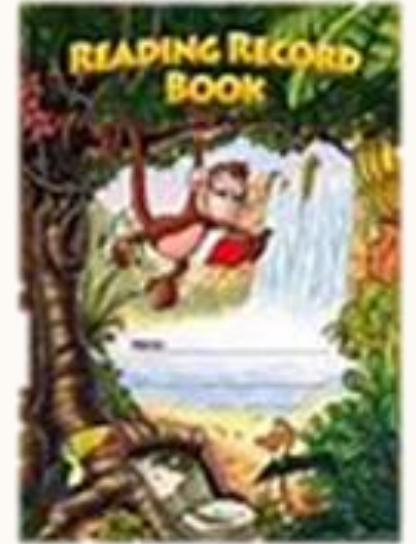

HOME READING

- We ask and expect children to read every day at home and to have their reading records signed
- Daily reading supports progress across the curriculum
- Bonding opportunities
- Consolidate new sounds
- A chance to talk about books and what new interests your child has
- **Accelerated Reading** – free choice books within Reading ranges to ensure appropriate challenge and support. Children can quiz when they finish books and complete an assessment once a term.
