Summer Cultural Day Tuesday 20th June

Important changes to school meals

There are changes coming to school lunches from June. Firstly, Enfield Catering is ceasing trading and we have had to find a new catering company to run the service. We participated with other primary schools in a joint tendering process that was won by STIR Food, who will start from next half term. As a result, there will be some changes to the school menu and due to a substantial kitchen refurbishment planned by the local authority starting on Monday 10th July we will only be able to offer a cold food menu for the last two weeks of this term. I am pleased to confirm that Len and his superb kitchen colleagues will continue to prepare and serve all meals.

The meals booking system may change but payment will continue through ParentPay. The menus for 3 weeks can be found on the last page of this newsletter.

The second major change is that the Mayor of London is funding all KS2 pupils (Y3-6) to have a free hot lunch for one year starting in September 2023. This is good news for parents/carers and their children.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to be part of the universal Infant meal programme.

An email with further information about Stir has been sent to all parents/carers on Monday.

OWL (Online Watch Link) is the main way that police are now communicating with their residents in Haringey and Enfield so we are looking to get as many people signed up as possible so that we can get crime prevention messages, crime stats, police meeting dates etc to as many people as possible. It's also a website for people to start running their own neighbourhood watches to help increase alertness to any suspicious behaviour in their areas. See page 7.

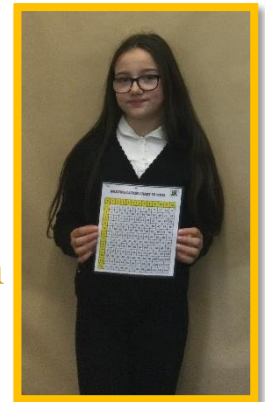

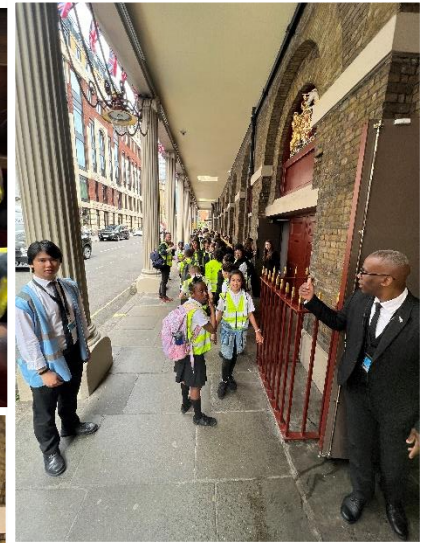

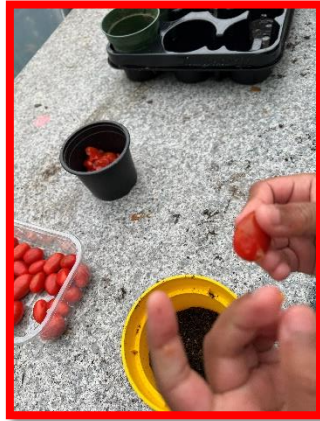
Frozen Trip

Polio campaign

As you may remember, in response to the findings of the polio virus in sewage in London boroughs last summer, the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI), advised that all children aged between 1 and 9 years, be offered an additional dose of Polio Vaccine.

Following on from this, the NHS in London is now offering polio (4 in 1 vaccine – Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio) vaccinations and measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) to unvaccinated or partially vaccinated children aged 1 to 11. As part of this catch-up campaign, we are only able to offer missed doses of Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Pertussis (4 in 1), and MMR to school aged children (Reception to Year 6). If you believe your child has missed any other immunisations, or your child is below reception age, please contact your GP practice.

The NHS School Aged Immunisation Team will be contacting the parents of children who are not fully vaccinated to sign a consent form for school-based vaccinations or clinic appointments.

- Can we ask that you check your child is up to date with 4 doses of Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio, and 2 doses of MMR by looking through their baby records (red book). Please see below Routine Childhood Immunisation Schedule.
- If our records indicate that your child may be missing immunisations, you will receive a text message from the NHS informing you that the School Aged Immunisation Team will be contacting you by telephone to discuss further.
