**IMPORTANT MESSAGE**

## Measuring litter



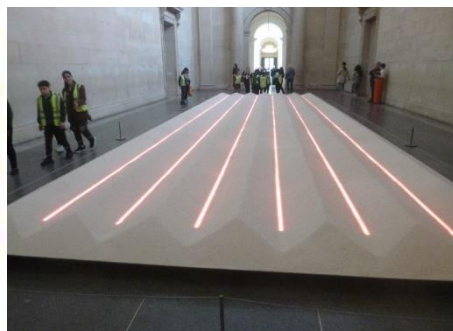

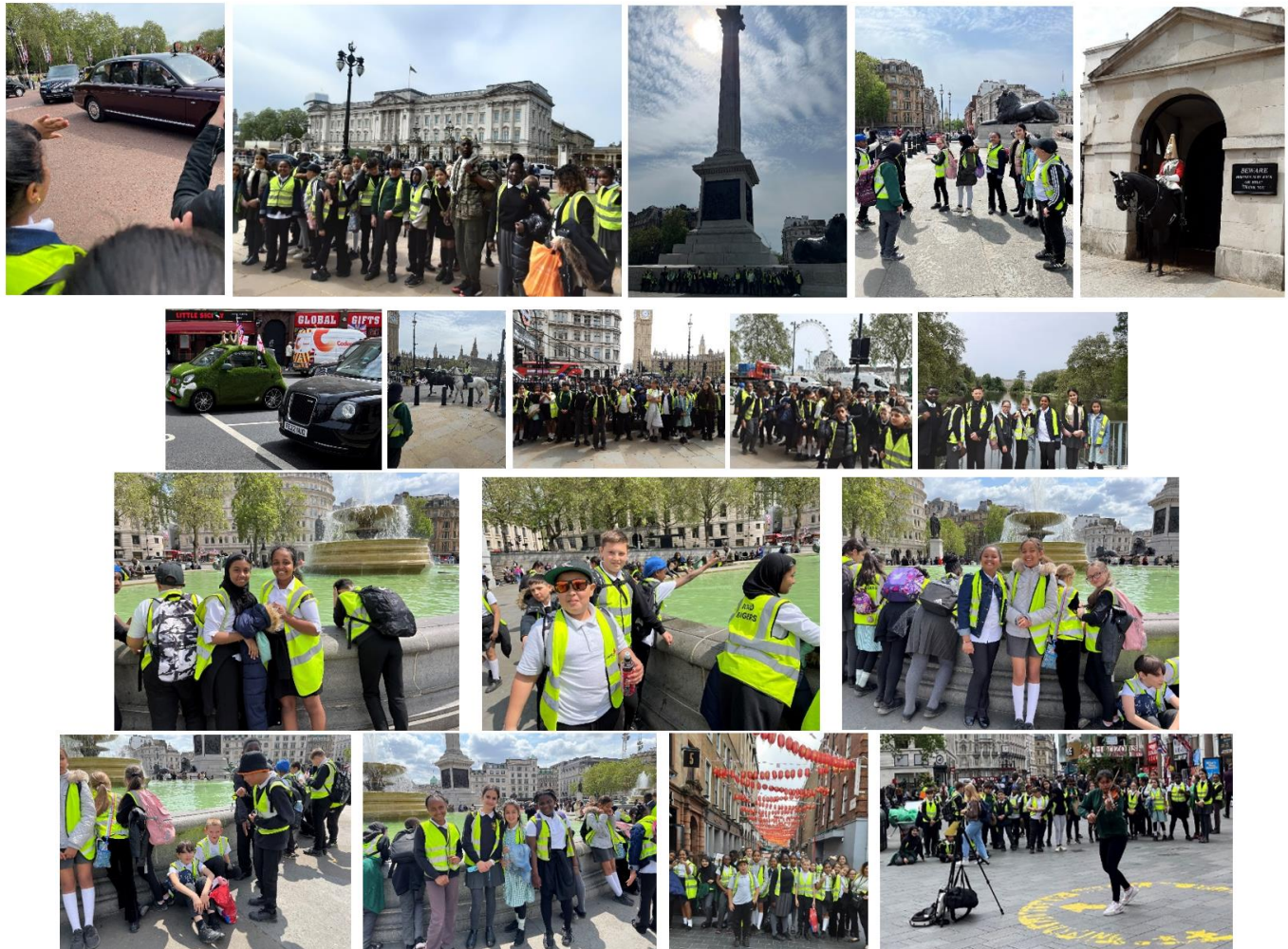


# CLASS 2C IS GROWING ...
