It has been a lovely start back after the May half term, everyone looks well rested and ready to learn. It is hard to believe that we have only 6 more weeks until summer holidays and we still have so much to fit in! Please check key dates below so you do not miss important events coming up.

Catering update

We have had a challenging first week with our new arrangements for ordering school meals. Thank you to all the parents who made the effort to book in for meals this week in advance. This was a huge help in a week where we were dealing with lots of issues. In spite of this we tried our best to accommodate all orders made and also provide meals for those who had not ordered due to the system being unavailable.

After many conversations with ParentPay, our system will now be up and running again on Monday morning ready to take orders for Tuesday onwards. I am happy to inform you that the issues with ParentPay incorrectly charging for meals has now been resolved and your account balances have been adjusted accordingly. If you still need help setting up your ParentPay account ready for next week, please speak to Miss Elliott in the office.

A big thank you again to all the parents that have used the ordering system so far, it is much appreciated and we hope you will continue to support this process going forward.

Remember: If a meal is not ordered, a meal cannot be provided.

Use of Adventure Trials

The adventure trials are only in use during morning break or lunchtime when it is your child's turn. They not for use before or after school as they are not supervised. We ask all parents to leave the school site as soon as they have collected their child/children. Please note the back gate is on a timer and will lock shortly after the end of the school day.

Hot weather

As the weather becomes warmer, please be reminded that children should wear sunscreen and hats to school. If your child suffers from hayfever, please remember to give them an antihistamine before school as the pollen count will be high. Please also ensure that your child brings a labelled bottle of water to school. We will be taking steps to keep the children safe by reminding them to drink water and keeping the classrooms as cool as possible during the day.

Phonics Screening Check

Children in Year 1 throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week in summer term, these checks are starting week beginning 12th June. Children in year 2 will also take the check if they did not achieve the required result when in Year 1 or if they have not taken the test before. These checks are done in a safe, secure environment and the children feel comfortable with the adults supporting them.

Some of the children in Y2 had an opportunity take part in a music workshop this week. Using the program MakeyMakey, the children explored how to turn an everyday object into a computer interface.



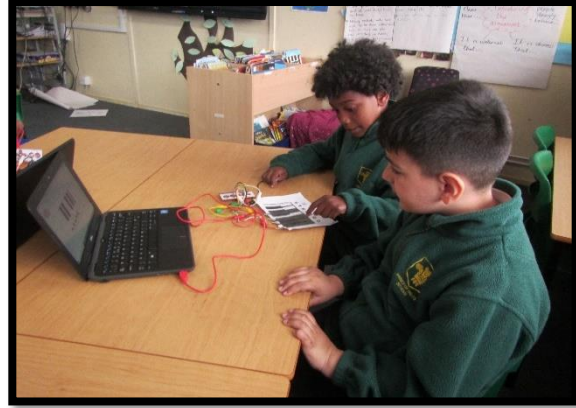
