

This week's Learners value: Curiosity



In his Monday assembly, Mr Verrall talked about the importance of curiosity. Albert Einstein said: "The important thing is to not stop questioning." and "I have no special talent. I am only passionately curious." We agree with Einstein that questioning and curiosity are the key to learning.

Our children are filled to the brim with questions and one topic that usually fires their imagination is dinosaurs, and so do the people working for: <u>Dinosaur Images & Facts.</u>

Besides their claim of having the largest online database, here you can also find an interactive globe as The Earth would have looked from space from 750 million years ago until the present day: Ancient Earth globe. You can input any place to see where it was located during the different geological periods, how its position changed thanks to continental drift and whether it was on dry land or covered in water.

How about Enfield? In this image you see the location of Enfield Town 470 million years ago during the Ordovician Period. The seas were diverse and the first coral reefs emerged. Algae were the only multicellular plant and there was still no complex life on land.

Now try imagine another 20 million years from now ... One thing is for sure, Enfield is going places!


