

# School Gardens Update

All the allotment beds are now covered in cardboard and mulch to prevent weeds growing and improve the soil quality. I'm attempting to move the school towards an environmentally friendly no-dig method of gardening.

I did a big leaf collection in the car park area and cleared all the built-up debris at the far end.

Gardening club made some lovely Christmas pots and twig stars to take home- they also dug up carrots for Rudolf! We had a really lovely last session and lots of positive feedback from the parents and children about the club!

This week, I have cut back all the large Buddleia bushes in the allotment garden as well as pruning the trees. All the waste material is now a "dead hedge" around the wildlife area- it can be added to as more waste is available and it will provide a wildlife habitat too.



# Statutory consultation: Prince of Wales Primary School Street on Salisbury Road

Dear resident / business owner,

Following the successful implementation of 18 School Streets across the borough Enfield Council are expanding the initiative to more schools and are proposing a School Street on Salisbury Road for Prince of Wales Primary School. This is part of the Journeys and Places programme delivered by Enfield Council which empowers people in Enfield to make sustainable choices for themselves, their community and our planet. We invite you to take part in the statutory consultation TG52/1552 to share your views on this School Street.

A 'School Street' is an area transformed into a pedestrian and cycling zone operating Monday to Friday during the school term, during set times at drop-off and pick-up times. School Streets aim to:

- · ensure the safety of school students as they arrive to and leave school,
- · improve the air quality near the school, and
- encourage more young people to walk and cycle to school.

When the School Street zone is in operation during the designated hours, motor vehicles cannot pass through the zone except for those who have received a permit and are exempt. Those who are eligible for exemptions include:

- residents who live within the zone,
- Blue Badge holders requiring access to the school (for example parents who hold a Blue Badge for a pupil),
- school staff who have been provided a permit by the school administration under exceptional circumstances,
- · businesses who operate within the zone, and
- emergency services (automatically exempt).



### Share your views

In partnership with Prince of Wales Primary School, Enfield Council is proposing a School Street as shown on the map overleaf and detailed in the proposed traffic order found at the link above. The proposed times of operation are 8.30am to 9.00am and 3.00pm to 3.30pm from Monday to Friday during school terms only. The School Street will be enforced using Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras.
