On Wednesday our boys' football team travelled to Edmonton County to play our last three games of the season. Having won just once this season, the boys were eager to implement new tactics under the watchful eye of VIP guest Mr Bless. Our first game with Edmonton County was fiercely contested with both teams having chances early on. With the score at 0-0 at half time, we knew we had a great chance of winning. However, an incredible free-kick and a deflected corner meant we trailed very quickly after the restart. Reggie was brought on straight away and made an immediate impact winning a penalty

that Ryan scored calmly. Unfortunately, we were unable to equalise and we lost the game 2-1.

The boys rallied together quickly, and after a few inspirational words from Captain Ronnie, we were ready to face St Edmunds. The boys played some fantastic football with Hatib and Aras absolutely everywhere on the pitch winning the ball back and picking out our forwards. The encouragement coming from every player on the team was a huge factor in the confidence shown by Aayden to score to go 1-0 up and



Hatib to double our lead very quickly afterward. With some brilliant defensive tackles from Kevin, David and Halil (on his debut) it meant we not only won, but kept a clean sheet for the first time this year.



After wild celebrations, we had to prepare ourselves quickly for our third and final game against Meridian Angel. What happened next, nobody expected. The boys were everywhere. They won every tackle, competed for every ball, passed the ball with confidence and dribbled around players with ease. A Reggie hat trick rounded off a 7-0 victory including a brilliant freekick goal from Ryan in the first half. Aayden (2) and Hatib completed the scoring in front of our fans who rightly agreed that this was their highlight of the season.

Having watched the development of the team from the start of the season to now, I am extremely proud of the boys. We didn't care about the results but focused on morale and team work which by the end of the season resulted into victories. RSE: Teaching of RSE

Relationships and Sex Education (RSE), along with Health Education, is a statutory requirement of the PSHE curriculum. The key purpose of RSE and Health Education, as stated by the DfE, is to provide pupils with the knowledge and skills to create informed decisions about their health and develop positive relationships in order to pursue a happy and successful adult life.

At Prince of Wales Primary School, we teach RSE through a scheme of work called The Christopher Winter Project (CWP), which contains age-appropriate materials for each year group. This ensures that we are fully compliant with the statutory duties stated in the National Curriculum for Science and RSE. We ensure that the pupils receive high-quality teaching of RSE in an age-appropriate manner.

I would very much welcome parents and carers to attend a meeting before we begin teaching RSE next half term. During this, I will share what will be taught in each year group, as well as explaining how it will be taught. You will also have the opportunity to ask any questions that you may have.
